What is

Restorative Action?

An approach to conflict resolution and communication based on Restorative Justice philosophy.

It focuses on
accountability and
repairing the harm
done, instead of on
retribution or
punishment.

It sees conflict as harm done to people, relationships and the community - Not just 'against the rules.'

It empowers those directly affected by the conflict to make decisions about the response.

Circle Process

qCJ uses "Circles" to help build relationships. Circles are used for conflict resolution, team projects, meetings and more.



What is a qCJ Circle?

A Circle is a dialogue that follows a particular set of rules. Circles have...

1. A Talking Piece

to make sure
everyone gets a
chance to speak and
to listen.

3. Guidelines

of respect that everyone agrees to follow

2. Keepers

to hold a safe space for participants.

4. Consensus

everyone has equal say in the outcome.

How Restorative Action can be used in schools?

Anyone can request a referral to qCJ at any time.

Youth can make a choice about how they want to handle conflict and build their community.

qCJ volunteers can teach school communities about Restorative Action.
